BUILDS MANY NESTS.

Attempt at Explaining an Old Habit of Male Wrens. The London Field tells of many cases where wrens have built several nests, only one of which has been occupied, and casts about for an explanation. It appears from what T. M. Ward, of Sibton, Yoxford, Suffolk, says, that it is the male bird that builds these unused nests. He also observed that the builder of a nest which was never used paused after each bit of nest material was put in place to sing in a loud voice. The odd nests are completely finished to all outward appearance. 
