STARS AND STRIPES OVER SANTIAGO

Spaniards March Out as Prisoners of War Without Arms.

TORAL'S MEN SAIL FOR SPAIN THIS WEEK

President McKinley and Secretary Alger Announce That all Arms Will be Turned Over to This Government and not be Returned to Spain.

WASHINGTON, July 16, 9 p. m.—The following message, just received, is given out by Adjutant General Corbin: "CAMP NEAR SANTIAGO, SANTIAGO, July 16.—The surrender has been definitely arranged and the arms will be turned over tomorrow morning and the army will be marched out as prisoners of war.

WASHINGTON, July 16.—The arms surrendered by the Spaniards at Santiago to General Shafter will be kept by the United States government.

WASHINGTON, July 16.—Unless present plans miscarry the Spanish soldiers surrendered at Santiago will sail from Cuba for Spain on July 25th—this date has been fixed by the war department and every effort will be bent toward expediting their departure.

Last Saturday a pair of horses backed off the wharf at Astoria with their load and were drowned.

About 2,500 pounds of gold bearing quartz will be sent to the Omaha exposition from the mines in the vicinity of Baker City.

The Hotel Shannon and four other buildings were destroyed by fire in Ashland the afternoon of the 15th, the loss aggregating \$10,000.

David F. May, deputy county treasurer of Clackamas county, and member of the board of school examiners died last week, aged 50 years.

Hereafter the mail for postoffices in this valley will be sent by way of Heppner. The new schedule of 34 hours from Portland will give its mail at least 28 hours earlier than it is possible to give by way of Sumpter under the existing schedule of that line.—Grant County News.
