WAS IN THE FIGHT.

Manila. Spokesman Review. Albert Sauter, of Medical Lake, has received an interesting letter from his brother, Lieutenant Frank C. Sauter, of company H, Thirteenth Minnesota volunteers, now at Manila. The let-

"Manila, Aug. 18, 1898 .- My Dear Brother: This is the first opportunity I have had to write you a few lines, as we fought our way into the city of Manila, and it was a terrible fight, too. On the morning of the 13th of August we at 5:30 and proceeded toward Manila to about three miles from the town, where were our SLEEPERS trenches or breastworks, as we called them. We all lay in the trenches, then signaled to Admiral Dewey, whereupon he started his bombardment at 9:45 a. m. It lasted 45 minutes. At that time-10:30-we started toward the city, proceeding to a point about two miles from it whistling in the air all around our heads. My ompany lay down in one street and fired at the paniards at about 75 yards distance, where they had advanced on us from 400 yards.

"My captain took a gun from one of the boys who was wounded and lying down in the place where the wounded man lay, fired about 30 ounds. Then he got up, and, as he was passing ne, he was shot and fell just to the left of me, and at the same moment another man fell to the ground on the right side of me. When I went in among the bullets I said, 'Well, here goeslive or die,' but as luck would have it I was not touched at all. It was an awful excitement there for about 30 minutes, then all shooting ceased on both sides. We then got our regiment together, or what was left of it, there being 36 wounded or killed, and marched into the city. where we are quartered in the armory, where the Spanish troops were up to the night before the Spanish surrendered, and now we are in cossession of all their arms and everything they had. I was through their arsenal and of all arms there are about 12,000 lying about in the mud and water, with our troops guarding them Dewey did not do much. He only destroyed one fortification, and did that up brown. went through it. It is a complete wreck.

"I have been through the city twice. I don't think much of it. It is a filthy place. I would not live here for any amount. We have all kinds of rain here. It is always raining, but we are getting so used to it that we do not mind it. For three or four days I had not had my shoes off at all, and they were wet all the time. A mackintosh is of no good here; there is too nuch rain. The water goes through a mackin osh like sand through a sleve, but we have ruband have cots to sleep in. There is talk about our going home soon. Well, I am getting tired of this dirty country. It is good and hot, too. few of the men dying off, one yesterday and one today. I have been in command of the company since the captain was shot, but he will be around again in about a week. The bullet that struck him went right through him. It entered his chest and came out of his shoulder. Captain Seebach, of the Red Wing com pany, was also shot. He is in bad condition, The builet went straight through him just above his stomach. One of the Red Wing men who

was shot died yesterday. "The only time that I wished that I was hom was when the bullets were whistling by our ears, but all we have to do now is guard duty about one day a week. If that keeps up I would ust as soon stay here another year or two and nake my \$125 per month. We do not have nuch time to spend our money. I buy Mexican dollars for 50 cents and loan them to the company boys, and pay day they pay me an Amer ican dollar for every Mexican dollar, so I make Il ou every American dollar I loan out and have a sure thing of getting it on pay day, which will se August Sist, for two months-July and Au-
