SPAIN WANTS INDEMNITY

The Administration Opposes Paying Any Money to Spain.

OREGON RECRUITS OFF FOR MANILA

Other Troops Will Sail Next Week—General Gomez Opposed to Further American Intervention.

PARIS, Oct. 17.—Spain has put in a bill of \$600,000,000 damages against the United States.

Cuba and Porto Rico are lost to her, and the Philippines are in such a condition that it might be better to give the islands all up than to undertake to retain the group without Manila.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17.—The administration is opposed to paying any money to Spain as compensation for lost territory.

The precedent to be followed is the one which has ruled since nations first made war—that the defeated nation shall suffer.

The heaviest war indemnity paid in modern times was that of France to Germany. Hostilities lasted only eight months, and the cost of the war was estimated at \$1,580,000,000.

The terms dictated to France by the allied powers of Europe in the Napoleon wars were considered the severest of any.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 17.—Troops from Camp Merriman to the number of 800 marched through the streets this morning to embark on the steamer Senator for Manila.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 15.—Next week will witness the departure of more troops for the Philippines, and the transports Senator and Valencia will probably sail Tuesday afternoon.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.—A dispatch from Havana says: It is generally believed a serious breach has taken place between the executive department of the Cuban republic and the leaders of the military forces.

General Juan Duaso, one of the closest advisers of Gomez, has arrived in Havana to consult the opponents of Maso and all those who favor a Cuban republic and oppose further American intervention.

Colonel Waring's first inspection of the city filled him with surprise. Conditions are much worse than he expected.
