Hold a Meeting and Organize Home Companies Nos. 1 and 2.  
A meeting was held at the council chambers yesterday afternoon for the purpose of taking preliminary steps in the organization of a fire department in this city. The meeting was attended by the young men who have consented to take upon themselves the responsibility of saving the town from destruction in case of a conflagration, and a great deal of enthusiasm was manifested in the cause by all present.  
W. A. Richardson was chosen as chairman of the meeting, and E. M. Shultz as secretary. After the chairman had stated the objects of the meeting organization was effected by electing the following officers: Frank Natter, chief; Jas. Thompson, assistant chief; Frank Roberts, captain Hose company No. 1; K. M. Scott, captain Hose company No. 2; J. T. Stewart, secretary; Jas. Hart, treasurer.  
A committee on constitution and by-laws was appointed as follows: G. W. Phelps, E. L. Freeland and W. A. Richardson, who will report at the next meeting, to be held at the council chambers on Sunday afternoon next, at 2 o'clock. It is especially urged that all who have signed the petition will be in attendance at this meeting, in order that permanent organization can be effected and that suitable men can be selected for the various positions in the companies.
