The Wheat Trade.
The Commercial Review of the 24th says the local market is very inactive, and the same is true of interior markets. The export value of wheat is too low for holders and they prefer to take chances on a raise in prices after the turn of the year rather than market at present quotations. The foreign demand for our cargoes is slow, and it is quite difficult for exports to effect sales. Our shippers really have no present need of wheat, stocks in store here being large, and will cover the wants of exporters for some time to come. The situation here may be summed up as follows: Buyers will only trade on real export values, and holders won't sell except at an advance. It is stated that a considerable portion of wheat in warehouse in the Palouse county is of poor quality, and not of grade which can be exported to Europe. Most of it will go to San Francisco, where there is a fair market for rejected wheat for feed. Receipts have been small during the weeks. Sales have been few, mostly in very small parcels. Reports have been made that heavy prices were bid, but they lack confirmation. Quotations for Walla Walla club, 60c@61; bluestem, 63c@64c, and Valley, 63c per bushel, and exporters' limits, the latter figures for good, round lots. Interior holders will sell club at 65c; bluestem, 68c, with no takers.

THE EASTERN BLIZZARD

The Entire Atlantic Seaboard Swept By Terrible Gale.
By the Associated Press.
BOSTON, Nov. 30.—From reports that have come by wire, mail and passengers to the Associated Press from New England points up to 10 o'clock this morning it was difficult to estimate the total loss of life and damage to the shipping along this coast, as the result of recent storm.

The list of disasters seems to grow every hour and from dispatches thus far received it appears that at least 30 schooners have been wrecked at different points from Eastport, Maine, to New Haven, Conn. Eighty-six schooners have been driven ashore and fourteen ashore and fourteen barges are aground.
This list does not include the thirty vessels, either wholly or partially wrecked in Boston harbor, nor half a dozen or more crafts which are reported missing. When lists are added, the number exceeds 110 vessels.
The loss of life is hard to determine. It is known that about 50 people perished in and about Boston harbor. Reports from other places in some cases state that the crew of this or that vessel escaped.
Many, however, state the fate of crews is unknown and no survivors have turned up. Life saving stations and incoming vessels have brought but few sailors from wrecks. Perhaps a score would cover those of whom nothing is known, not including the 90 or more who were on board the Portland.
