CHILD SOVEREIGNS.

The Status of Royal Minors in the Old World.

It is an interesting circumstance that no fewer than three European thrones are occupied by children. Since the abdication of King Milan, his son Alexander, who was born in August, 1876, and is now, consequently, fourteen years old, has been the titular ruler of Serbia, though the country is really governed by a board of regents. The present King of Spain, Alfonso XIII, is an infant, and during his minority the normal head of the monarchy will be his mother, the Queen-Regent Christina. By the death of King William III the crown of Holland devolves on his daughter, Wilhelmina, who is in her eleventh year. Here again, the child's mother, Queen Emma, is temporarily invested with the royal functions.

What likelihood, asks the New York Ledger, is there that these children will ever rule in their own names? The young King of Serbia has evidently the poorest chance of reigning. The quarrel between his father and his mother, the ex-Queen Nathalie, has divided his partisans, while the pro-Russian party, now dominant in Serbia, aims to displace the Obrenovitch dynasty to which King Milan and his son belong, and substitute the pretender Karageorgewitch. As to the infant King of Spain, his subjects have been hitherto withheld from revolutionary outbreaks by a certain sentiment of chivalry. But as the sovereign grows older, this feeling will disappear, and it will prove extremely difficult for his supporters to make head against the Spanish Republicans on the one hand and the Carlists on the other.

The close approach to universal suffrage which has recently been made in Spain must greatly strengthen the popular leaders who regard a monarchical system with contempt and detestation. The girl-Queen of Holland has the best chance of retaining her position, but her hour of trouble will come when her marriage is discussed. Her mother, who is a German, will naturally wish her to marry a German Prince; but such a project is certain to be resisted by Russia and France, nor is it likely to be viewed with favor by the Hollanders, who dread absorption in the German Empire. On the whole, there is something pathetic in the situation of these child sovereigns.
