WOOL.

There is still no movement in the Heppner wool market. Frank Lee was here a few days this week, being the only buyer who has dropped down for quite a while.

Heppner growers seem confident that prices are going to come up, and are able to hold. In the Heppner warehouses there is now stored 2,000,000 pounds of wool, with 1/2 million still on tributary ranches.

The latest from Boston is that the tone of the market is steady; the anxiety felt regarding the recent failure of that wool held by these dealers would be forced on the market, was allayed by the fact that the wools are to be offered on the market the same as before.

There has been a renewed inquiry for Oregon wools, and some good sized sales of eastern have been effected, mostly at a clean cost of 47@48c.
