There are at present in Morrow coun ty 263,535 head of sheep, and O. E. Farnsworth, who has been running sheep here for 23 years says that sheep pay an annual 50 per cent. net profit on the investment. He says they have been doing that for the past three years, but that for 5 years previous to that, in free trade days, sheep paid practically nothing, and many men ran behind. Sheep are herded here in average bands of 2000 head, and herders get an average of \$30 a month and board
