IN CALIFORNIA. The California Wool Growers' Association was organized at Sacramento, last week. Resolutions were adopted, setting out the fact that the pasturage of sheep on public lands and forest reservations is prohibited.

There are from 200,000 to 250,000 sheep on the plains around Huron, and all are doing well. Feed is very good, and lambing is going on.

IN ARIZONA. Superintendent of Forest Reserves I. B. Hanna, of Santa Fe, has received an order from the Department of the Interior prohibiting sheep grazing on the Black Mesa forest reserve in Arizona.

BOSTON WOOL MARKET.

Boston, Feb. 2.—The American Wool & Cotton Reporter says: The wool market has been more active the past week, and a somewhat improved feeling is noted in the trade.

While prices are, on the whole, in favor of the buyer, there has not been sufficient recession as yet to justify a general lowering of quotations.

For Oregon wools there has been a pretty good inquiry, and some No. 2's have been sold on the basis of 45c.—a little lower than a fine medium grade.

IT PAYS.

It is now generally admitted that sheep-raising and wool-growing in Morrow county are pretty fair paying propositions.

There are at present in Morrow county 263,535 head of sheep, and O. E. Farnsworth, who has been running sheep here for 23 years says that sheep pay an annual 50 per cent. net profit on the investment.

Present prices on sheep here are \$5 a head for breeding ewes and \$2.50 a head for yearlings of mixed sexes delivered after shearing next spring.
