MICRODE-PROOF HOUSE.

All the Air Sterilized Before Entering—See Kinsley's Book.

One of the most dramatic events on earth is that recently created at Yokohama, Japan. The disease house is a dust-proof, air-proof, microde-proof building of glass.

It stands on the open, level ground of the Japanese island of Yokohama. The house is 14 feet long, 25 feet wide and 12 feet high. Large panes of glass, one-half inch thick and about four inches apart, are set in iron frames so as to form the sides of a cellular building block.

There are no window sashes, the air escapes being through several small openings around the upper part of the second story, but through which no air from the outside is admitted. The space between the panes of glass is filled with a solution of salts, which absorbs the heat of the sun, so that the rooms of this house are much cooler than those protected by the thickest shades.

In the evening the interior is heated by the salts radiating during the day. So effective is the system of regulating the temperature that a few hours of sunlight, even in a freezing weather, will render the house habitable. It is only when several cloudy days follow in succession that artificial heat is needed. Then it is supplied by pumping in hot air. Dr. Van der Heyden thinks he has solved the problem of a complete germicide on a big scale.

SPIDERS AND THEIR WAYS.

Marked Differences in Habits, Tastes and Characters Shown.

We find a marked difference in habits, tastes and characters among spiders as among human beings. Some kinds prefer always living in houses or cellars, not seeming to care for any fresh air or out-door exercise.

Mr. Jesse tells of two spiders that lived for 15 years in opposite corners of a drawer which was used for soap and candles. One spider, which he named "Tommy," spent its life in the earth, in dwelling under stones or behind the house back on trees, and others the under water. Many never leave their webs, but patiently wait, hoping some insect will become entangled in the snares they have spun.

Others dash about and seize upon every insect that crosses their path. The most numerous of all are those that spin out a web, and in one of their own little threads. Many kinds of insects are attracted to them, and when they are taking the famous voyage to the Beagle, they say, "The little arachnid, as soon as it arrived at land, was very active, running about, sometimes letting itself fall, then reascending the same thread, it would run with facility on the surface of the water."

In the lightest summer weather, if we observe closely, we may sometimes see some of our own small spiders ascend to the tops of trees, fences and other high objects, rise on their legs, turn the spinner upward, throw out a quantity of silk and sail away. They can be seen plentifully any day in October or November, before the cold weather or the winter comes on. They grasp the slender thread with their feet and seem to be enjoying themselves as much as the birds and butterflies.—Marguerite W. Leighton, in Appleton's Popular Science Monthly.

MANAGING A FURNACE.

Not Much Trouble When Properly Understood.

A properly managed furnace should be reached but twice a day, early in the morning and late at night. It is economy to put on a full supply of coal and arrange the dampers to control the fire, rather than to control it by means of the fuel used. After thoroughly shaking down the furnace in the morning, put on a small amount of coal and let this burn up to give a body to the fire. Then fill the furnace full, for the gas burn up, and close the dampers. As soon as the house is thoroughly warm, close all the dampers tightly. If the fire has burned down very low in the night, put on coal and a little wood, if necessary, before you shake it down. Open all the dampers and let this come up to give a body to the new fire, and then fill up with a little more coal, shake it down and fill up the furnace. Never make a heater fire on top. If the weather is warm and the drafts of the heater are strong, do not shake it in the morning, but shake it by allowing the ashes to remain. Empty the ashes under the grate, however, every morning carefully, and keep the heater and the premises around it brushed free from ashes as you would a parlor stove. This will prevent the fire of ashes drifting into the hot air pipes and being blown up into the room. If the air pipes are carefully brushed out every season, there will be less trouble from the "dust of the heater." A good furnace connected with a radiator box which furnishes an abundant supply of fresh, cold air remains one of the most wholesome as well as the most economical of heat.

FOR CLOSET FLOORS.

Arsenical floor covering for closets is the most effective. It is readily put down and fitted.
