New York and Philadelphia Streets Blocked.

BIG FIRE IN ALASKA MINES

Through Efforts of Senator Mitchell Senate Passes Indian War Veteran Pension Bill—Miss Stone Released.

NEW YORK, Feb. 17.—New York City has borne the brunt of the fiercest snow storm that has struck this section of country since the great blizzard of 1888.
