Secretary Long Has Resigned Representative Moody of Massechusetts Beleeted to Take His Place in Cabinet.

London, March 10 .- General Lord Methuen and four guns have been captured by General Delarey. General Methuen was wounded in the thigh Three British officers and fourty-eight men were killed. Five British officers and seventy-two men were wounded. One British officer and 200 men are missing. The fight occurred before dawn on March 7th between Windburg and Litchtenburg, Orange River Col ony, The British force numbered 1200 men. The Boers captured all British baggage. General Methuen is retained as a prisoner.
