berlain is elected governor by a plu-  
rality of 247 votes.

Mr. Keithly had no opposition, as the  
Republican candidate failed to qualify.  
This is the first time in the history of  
Morrow county that the entire Republi-  
can ticket was elected.

G. W. Phelps for joint representative,  
carried the county by a plurality of 87  
and in Umatilla county is about 150  
ahead.

J. W. Scriber for joint senator, in  
this county has a plurality of 94 over  
Pierce, but is defeated.

The Republican state ticket is elected  
with the exception of governor.
