HOOD RIVER STRAWBERRIES.

Season's Output About 85 Cars, at \$125,000 Net.

The bulk of the Hood River strawberry crop has been shipped, and the total number of crates for the season will be something over 55,000, equal to about 85 carloads of fruit.

Most of the berries this year have been sent east of the Rocky mountains in refrigerator cars, and the three cars sent out the 22nd inst. bring the total car lot shipments up to 61.

This was the banner season for the Hood River strawberry growers, the total number of crates marketed being 55,000 or 20,000 over the number shipped last year.

The berries were generally of an excellent quality, but the local shipping agencies had some trouble this season to keep inferior fruit from going on the market.
