

UNCLE SAM'S ACTIVE VOLCANO

An Alaskan Mountain That Has Been Active for 100 Miles.

It is a fact that the volcanic activity of the Alaskan States within the last few years has not been so active as it has been in the past.

Recently, said Mr. Perolat, "I have seen some references to the phenomenon of ash scattered over Alaska, and this, with the accompanying statement that no volcano in American territory is active, would lead one to suspect that these volcanic ashes had blown from some Alaskan volcano."

He said that he had been away with a detachment that had been sent to Kik trading post, and that the Indians trapping in the country of the cone were much alarmed."

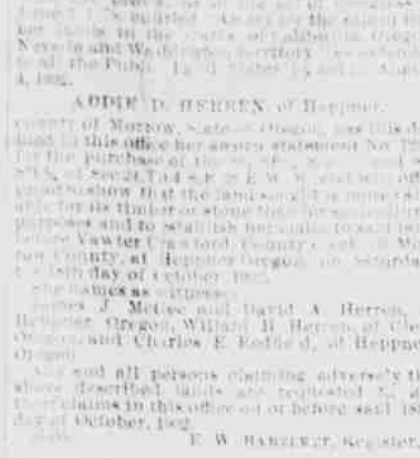
