

Now that fresh fruits will be coming on one after the other the crisp little cakes made from fresh oatmeal will be found a delightful accompaniment. They are easily made, and the following recipe will give excellent results, both in number and quality. Put half a cup of fine oatmeal in the mixing bowl; add two cups of flour sifted with two teaspoonsful of baking powder and one of salt and rub into this two table-spoonsful of sugar. Beat an egg until light; stir this into half a cup of cream and milk, half and half; and with this mix with a fork the contents of the bowl to a light dough. Roll out on the floured board, cut rather thin and bake in a moderate oven. The extra quantity of flour is required to overbalance the slight heaviness of the oatmeal.
