M. P. Isenberg, of Hood River, has been appointed supervisor of the northern portion of the Cascade forest reserve, to succeed W. H. H. Duffur, whose appointment was recalled by President Roosevelt several months ago.

The Oregon Wool Grower's Association which met last week at Pendleton, elected the following officers: Douglas Belt, president, re-elected; Geo. A. Young, vice-president; J. H. Gwin, secretary and treasurer. The association endorsed the creation of the Blue Mountain forest reserve.

The recent rains were general and were welcomed all over Eastern Oregon.

Over 1000 head of beef cattle from the range of southern Grant county were started toward Pendleton this week from which place they will be shipped to market. This large band is the property of J. D. Combs, of John Day, and Dave Magill and H. H. Trowbridge, of Izee. The Combs band of 400 head was bought by a buyer named Ball, who received them at the ranch of J. W. Powell last Wednesday. The band of Dave Magill and H. H. Trowbridge are contracted to J. C. Louergan, an old time beef buyer on the Pacific coast. The bands will be delivered at Pendleton and will constitute one of the largest bands of cattle shipped from that point for some time.—Blue Mountain Eagle.

Congressman M. A. Moody is expected to visit Pendleton in the near future.
