WILL OF DAVID BAKER FILED FOR PROBATE.

One Marriage License Issued--New Court House Nearing Completion.

Stone work on the new court house is almost finished. Work of putting on the roof will be commenced next week. This will take about 15 days. The furnace and boiler for the steam heating apparatus has arrived and is now being placed in the basement.

IN THE CLERK'S OFFICE.

The last will and testament of David Baker, deceased, has been filed with the county clerk for probate. J. M. Baker is the executor. There are five heirs. Julia A. Baker the widow is to have use and possession of the estate until her death.

The property is to be divided between James M. Baker, David F. Baker, sons, and Lucretia O. Markham, daughter, with the exception of one eighth which is to be equally divided between David V. Dickson and Sarah Ida King, grandchildren.

The estate consists of 638 acres of land near Ione, valued at \$6000 and personal property valued at \$1000.

The executor is required to give a bond of \$2000.

Death of Mrs. Clark.

Mrs. Cynthia Clark died at the residence of her daughter Mrs. Geo. Swagart, in this city, Monday, September 22, 1902, at the advanced age of 92 years, 8 months and 15 days.

Mrs. Clark was a pioneer lady of Eastern Oregon and was highly respected. She was undoubtedly the oldest person in Morrow county, and after a life's work which left that great monument composed of good deeds, she passed peacefully away under a weight of years far above the average allotted to mankind.

Mrs. Cynthia Clark whose maiden name was Gooch was born in Madison county, Kentucky, January 7, 1811.

In 1830 she was united in marriage with O. S. Clark and moved to Missouri. In 1859 Mr. Clark died. In 1865, with the family, Mrs. Clark crossed the plains to Oregon and settled near what is now the town of Weston, where she lived until 12 years ago, when she came to Morrow county.

The following children survive her: John Clark, of Oakland, Calif; Mrs. Nancy Warmoth, of Pascanta, Calif; Mrs. Cas Booher, Trenton, Mo; O. S. Clark, of Anatone, Wash; W. A. Clark, of Walla Walla, Wash; Mrs. Geo. Swagart, of Heppner, Oregon; Mrs. Julia O'Hara, of Newport, Idaho.

Mrs. Clark's body was shipped to Weston, Tuesday, and the remains were laid at rest at that place Wednesday afternoon.

Hitching posts for teams and saddle horses should be placed off of the main business street in Heppner.
