German as well as American locomotive builders are cutting under the feet of the English manufacturers. United States Consul Langer of Solingen, Germany, says in a late report that orders have been recently booked by German manufacturers for 100 locomotives to go to Siam, Italy, India and Denmark. Thirty-two have been ordered by the East Indian Railway. The German manufacturers' bids were 20 per cent lower and the time of delivery 25 per cent shorter than the best English bids. Twenty-two tank locomotives were also bought from a Berlin firm for the Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway, the bid being £27,300 less than the lowest English bid and twenty-eight weeks shorter in the time of delivery.

Grims, representing the Union Meat Co., Portland, arrived in Pendleton one day last week from a trip in the John Day country, and all through Eastern Oregon and Idaho. 300 head of fine cattle were purchased in the Izee country, in Grant county, on the south fork of the John Day. Prices averaged \$43 per head for the cattle.

Manny Howard, the noted stock rustler, has again been sentenced to the penitentiary by Judge Eakin in the circuit court of Baker county. The sentence this time is for five years. He was sentenced for seven years before, and served for a time in the penitentiary, when he was released, pending an appeal to the supreme court.

John Town of Great Falls, Montana, who has purchased 11,500 sheep in Umatilla county, finished shipping this week. These sheep

are going to Montana to be fed and held for the Chicago and St. Paul markets this winter.

Reports have reached Pendleton of the killing of elk on Camas creek. This is in violation of the law and is also a crime. That the elk have been killed there is no doubt, but just as to whom the guilty parties are there is some question although it is believed that those who did the killing are known and will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

Outside cattle buyers are offering for cows with their calves \$30 per head, this price we understand to be the highest figure paid, but some parties refuse to accept this very low price, declaring that they have been offered nearly one-half of \$30 for their calves.—Burns Item.
