WORK OF HORSETHIEVES.

Two Good Horses Stolen From a Chinaman.

Tuesday afternoon Sheriff Shutt received a message from McLaughlin's saw mill, stating that two horses had been stolen the night before. The message stated that the thieves had been tracked as far as the Waddell place on Butter Creek.

After receiving the message, the sheriff was soon in the saddle and rode out to the mill.

The horses belonged to Joe McLaughlin's Chinese cook at the mill and were stolen Monday night. The animals were valued at \$200.

Arriving at the mill, Mr. Shutt found that the tracks leading to the Waddell place were not made by the thieves. He hunted all day Wednesday, but was unable to find a trace of the miscreants or the missing horses. Mr. Shutt is of the opinion that the horses were kept in the timber and were taken into Grant county. The rains obliterated all tracks.

The sheriff is of the opinion that there is an organized band of horse-thieves in the vicinity where the horses were taken.

A band of 100 goats were stolen from the Rogue River farm of William Bybee a few nights ago, and no trace of the thief can be found.
