Usually sheep are wintered on the "western denerto," a big strip of range country.nn Beaver Iron and Millard counties, extonding out into Nevade, but, owing to ligh moiture falling during the past 10 moths, the feed is very lightin tha country. It is anticipated that there will be very heavy snows this winter and sheepmen are not inclined to riak their herd where heavy losses seen certain. This range, however, is abou the only available winter range in this
section, but with ite forbidding pros pects, sheep owners are in a quandar as to what to do. Several are talkin of taking their sheep into the Dixie country and Arizona. Tbere ie no surplus bay and straw on which to feed general exodus of sheep for the far soath will begin in a few days. A num ber of sheepmen are talking of dispos ing of their entire herde rather than run this winter's risk.
