

**To Build a Smelter.**

Grants Pass, Nov. 9.—Colonel T. W. Draper, manager of the mines of the Waldo Smelting & Mining Company, a Waldo, announces that his company has decided to put in a 100-ton smelter at once at its copper mines in the Waldo district. The smelter is to be erected at Taki'ma, the new town that has sprung up near the mines, and on the line of the proposed Oregon & Pacific Railroad.

A smelter at Waldo will be of great benefit to the vast mineral district of that section, as, aside from treating the ores of the Waldo Smelting & Mining Company's mines, it would also do a general custom business. A number of good mines of that section, would be able to do their smelting at home and with much less expense than heretofore, as they have been obliged to haul their ores to the railroad and ship to California. Many mineowners who could afford to ship their ores will be able to operate their properties by having a smelter at home.

**Postoffice Physicians to Go.**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—The Postmaster-General has ordered that the post-office physician be abolished in all post-offices in cities under 500,000 population. There are about a dozen cities in this

class where such positions exist, and a number of postmasters reported that the position was not necessary. It is expected that this action will save the government about \$10,500 a year.

**Kearsarge Off for Maneuvers.**

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—The battle ship Kearsarge, flagship of the North Atlantic squadron, started south today from the navy-yard with Rear-Admiral Higginson aboard to begin organizing the great fleet which is to go through war maneuvers in the Caribbean Sea during the winter. At Hampton Roads the Kearsarge will meet other vessels of the fleet.

**Asparagus Salad**

Wash the asparagus clean; cook five minutes in slightly salted boiling water; drain, add more boiling water and cook 15 minutes.
