

WORK OF ANARCHIST.

St. Pierre Fire Charged to Them-- Town in Great Excitement.

St. John's, N. F., Nov. 14.—The disastrous fire which broke out in St. Pierre, Miquelon, November 1, and destroyed the government building, the Roman Catholic Cathedral, and a number of other buildings, is now believed to have been the work of the local colony of anarchists. It was known that the cathedral was set on fire by incendiaries, and last Sunday night an attempt was made to blow up the powder magazine there, which contains the entire stock of explosives for the islets. Had the attempt proved successful, the town would have been destroyed. Two individuals, one of them a Pasque and the other a Spaniard, have been arrested on the charge of complicity in the affair. A body of gendarmes is patrolling the precincts of the powder magazine day and night. The inhabitants are in a state of great excitement.
