THE COUNTY COURT CONVENED WEDNESDAY.

Large Increase of Business in Clerk's Office During Closing Months of Past Year.

The county court is now in session with the usual amount of county business for consideration.

For the months of November and December the fees earned by the county clerk amounted to \$991. This is almost double the amount earned over any time previous for the same length of time showing an increase of business of almost 100 per cent in the clerk's office for the closing months of the past year.

FOR PARKER OR OLNEY.

Southern Democrats Want Old-Time Democrat for President.

Washington, Jan. 2.—Democratic statesmen in Washington are lining up on the next Presidential nomination, and declaring themselves quite freely. Senator Carmack, of Tennessee, is out for Judge Parker, of New York, and Representative Underwood says that Richard Olney, of Massachusetts, is his choice. Both of these men have been rampant free silverites, but they are now willing to go for an Eastern man who is known to have always been sound on the money question. Underwood says that Olney is an "old-time Democrat," and what the party needs is to get back to old-time principles, which are dear to the hearts of the people.

The Southerners are determined to commit themselves and their section against Bryanism as early as possible. Nearly all of them would prefer Gorman to any other man, but the fact that they declare for either Parker or Olney means that they realize that Gorman is an impossibility, and that he could not command the necessary votes in the convention.

Sheep Notes.

Deputy Sheep Inspector Burns, who recently made a trip over the range, reports that there have been no losses to sheep owners worth mentioning so far, this season. The two storms there were severe enough; but they were luckily followed by thawing weather, when even the nights were warm. But losses may be looked for from now on, as the cold weather has crusted the snow, and the sheep cannot get down to the feed underneath it.

The worst loss of sheep in Montana from poisoning for years occurred recently when 3,000 head belonging to Sigmund Thambling, a prominent sheepman of Melville, Sweet Grass county, died from eating the loco weed. Although a few sheep have died occasionally from this same cause in that section of the country, still no such loss has ever been sustained by any one.

The Sweetwater Ranch Company in Utah has put a stop to the invasion of the pastures by the herds belonging to the Utah Mormon sheep men who have been running large bands of sheep in eastern Utah and Uinta county. Beckstead, a large sheep owner, had about 20 bands, which were to be run on the range of the Sweetwater Ranch Company, who have a lease on about 900,000 acres of railroad land, and gave no heed to notices that the land was leased. The foreman and herders were arrested, charged with malicious trespass, fined \$100 each and given notice that every day they were on the leased lands they would have to answer to a new charge. The sheep were withdrawn. This is regarded as a definite settlement of a vexed question, the inroads of outside sheep heretofore have almost destroyed the range. Last year there were over 1,000,000 sheep from Utah and Uinta counties pastured upon the Sweetwater range, and they completely ravaged it, so that all sheep came off in poor condition. The range is now in good condition and will winter the sheep handsomely.
