WORK AT MINING

MINERS WILL SOON BE TAKING
OUT COAL.

Already Engaged by Heppner Rail-
road & Coal Company for
Active Operations.

Since the shut down of prospect work
at the Heppner Railroad & Coal com-
pany's coal mines at the head waters of
Willow creek, everything has been very
quiet in the mining district.

This has been caused by deep snows
and bad weather which made it very
difficult to carry on operations.

The Heppner coal mines will take on
new life just as soon as spring opens.
A superintendent and force of miners
have already been engaged and are now
waiting for the snow to get out to com-
mence active operations.

The Gazette is informed that the
mines will now be opened up from a
miner's standpoint, prospect work hav-
ing all been finished.

It is expected that coal will be taken
out in quantities at least to supply the
local demand.

It has not yet been determined just
when railroad construction work will be
commenced.

FELL UNDER THE WHEELS.

Mulatto Boy Run Over and Killed
by O. R. & N. Train.

A telegraph message was sent to
Coroner F. B. Kistner, in this city, Fri-
day evening, stating that the body of a
boy had been found on the railroad
track, about a mile below Coyote, a
station on the main line of the O. R. &
N. in this county.

Coroner Kistner empaneled a jury and
went to the scene of the accident, Satur-
day.

The body when found proved to be
that of a mulatto boy, apparently about
13 years of age. He had been horribly
mangled, the wheels cutting off a leg
and an arm and otherwise mutilating
the body.

W. W. Smead, Clyde Wells, Wm.
Sprowls, Oscar Neal, Bud Shipley and
L. B. Johnson who were empaneled as
a coroner's jury, rendered a verdict the
substance of which was that the un-
known boy came to his death by being
run over by a train while trying to steal
a ride.

The boy was well dressed, wearing
knee breeches, on which there was a
tag giving the size as 13.

Nothing could be found by which to
identify the remains. The only thing
found in his pockets was a sandwich.

The remains were brought to this city
and buried in the the Masonic cemetery.

MAYFLOWER MINES.

Active Work Has Been Carried on
All Winter.

Dan Stalter, president of the Heppner
Mining company, and superintendent of
the Mayflower mines in the Greenhorn
district, came in Monday evening to at-
tend to some business of the company
in this city.

Mr. Stalter left Susanville on Friday
and came across on horseback, and he
says that it is a hard and tiresome trip
at this time of year.

Mr. Stalter left Heppner about the
first of January, and with a force of men
has been working on the Illinois mine
all winter. During the winter they
have run a tunnel 130 feet on the main
lead, and have been rewarded with
very flattering showings, the lead being
six feet in width, and is free milling.

Mr. Stalter is highly elated over the
prospects and says that the develop-
ment work brings better prospects all
the time.

Mr. Stalter will go back the first part
of next week.

On the Illinois, work will be com-
menced on a tunnel of 350 feet, which
will take from three to four months to
complete. If this one still continues to
be free milling, a stamp mill will be in
operation by early fall. There is every
indication that the ore will continue to
be free milling.

With the opening of spring, there is
considerable activity in the Greenhorn
district. The attention of capital is be-
ing attracted that way and several
mines have been bonded.

The Greenhorn district is undoubtedly
a very rich mineral belt which has been
kept back by extreme isolation. While
this country has been prospected for
years, prospectors cannot do any-
thing. Like all other quartz propo-
sitions it takes large capital to handle the
mountains of rich ore that will be
handed and be a great industry in the
future. Some day there will be a rail-
road into that country and the Greenhorn
district will come into prominence.

Mr. Stalter states that the mountain
lands were covered with about eight
feet of snow most of the winter.

A. M. SLOCUM WILL PUT IN
ELECTRIC PLANT.

Surveyors Will Soon Commence
Work Laying Out water
Ditch.

A. M. Slocum, the enterprising mill
man who has for some time been con-
sidering the feasibility of putting in an
electric plant at his mill to utilize water
power and transmit electric power to
this city, after thorough investigation
has decided that the proposition is
feasible, and just as soon as the weather
will permit will put out a force of
surveyors to map out the route for a
water ditch and wiring.

Mr. Slocum's mill is located near a
prong of Willow creek, in the Blue
mountains, 14 miles south of Heppner,
and by digging a ditch can use the
waters of Willow creek with a fall of
500 feet.

He is convinced that the supply of
water is great enough with the fall that
he has to develop 250 horse power in
this city.

The plant when complete will cost
\$20,000 and Mr. Slocum expects to com-
mence operations as soon as spring
opens.
