## MANY HOMELESS BY FIRE.

### Quebec Flames Eat up Two Hundred and Fifty Houses.

St. Hyacinthe, Quebec, May 21.—A fire today in the shoe factory of Cote Bros., destroyed that and half a dozen other industries and 250 houses, leaving nearly a quarter of the city's population homeless tonight. The loss is placed at \$400,000.

Nobody knows how the fire started. When it was first noticed, it had secured a firm grip upon the Cote factory. The wind was blowing half a gale at the time, and the buildings in the immediate vicinity were of such a character as to fall easy prey to the flames.

The burned district is practically the same as that destroyed in 1876. The river Yamasaka flows through the town in the shape of a letter V. St. Antoine street runs along the top of the V and practically everything south of that street was burned.

Beside Cote Bros.' shoe factory, the industrial establishments burned included: Hudson & Allard, machinists; the Duplessis Pegging & Sewing Company; C. A. Hamel & Co., Lussier Bros., J. Girouard, J. Mathew & Co. The Frontenac, Union and Ottawa Hotels were also burned.

### Harriman Operated Upon.

New York, May 21.—E. H. Harriman was operated on today for appendicitis. At the conclusion of the operation the physicians announced that it had been successful.

The operation took place at 8 o'clock in the Hotel Netherlands. The patient was laid on a specially constructed platform and the ether was administered by Dr. Bennett. The operation proper was performed by Dr. William Boll, while the other physicians in attendance were Walker, Fenton, Janeway, Lytle and Morris, the family physician. The operation was performed at the hotel because two of Mr. Harriman's children are suffering from scarlet fever, and his home is quarantined.

Mr. Harriman is in excellent condition, having taken a drive in the park yesterday afternoon. He was not at all nervous, and had no fear that the operation would prove dangerous.

Miss Mary Harriman has been her father's nurse since his return from his Western trip. She was at the hotel in an adjoining room during the operation.

When the appendix was removed it was found to be much inflamed. The operation was made at the request of Mr. Harriman, who said he did not want to run the risk of a recurrence of the attack, which might come at an inopportune time.

At midnight Mr. Harriman's condition was said to be excellent.

Chicago, May 21.—Unless immediate changes are effected in the methods of supplying Chicago with milk the health department asserts that the public health will be seriously menaced and that tremendous increase in infant mortality during the summer months will follow. The one delivery a day plan now followed by milk wagons is he'd to be a danger, as the milk delivered in the city is 36 hours old, on an average, before it reaches the customer. The effects are already seen in a rising death rate among infants. Health Commissioner Adams has sent a letter to the heads of the milk wagon drivers' union, asking that the problem be given serious consideration. In the Ghetto already three riots have occurred.
