

Open For Settlement.

At Twin Falls, Idaho, 60,000 acres of land under the Twin Falls canal, will be thrown open for settlement on July 1.

At present there are 300 men working on the main canal, 16 miles of which is completed. A town site has been laid out at Milner, which already has 150 population. The state will open a land office at Shoshone, where all entries on the tract will be made. There are now enough applications filed to cover the entire body to be thrown open.—East Oregonian.
