

PORTAGE ROAD.

Engineer Hammond Says It Can be Built Inside Appropriation.

Salem, July 24.—The report of Engineer E. A. Hammond, on the Celilo portage road, has been filed with the board of supervision.

The report contains maps and charts giving the most minute details of the route and containing all the information that three months of expert and painstaking labor can accumulate upon the subject.

The first item of interest to the people contained in the report is, that the road can be built for the \$165,000 appropriation for the purpose, barring any unnecessary expense, such as litigation or exorbitant prices for right of way.

The proposed line passes through the property of but five private owners—the O. R. & N. Company, I. H. Taft, Senbert Brothers, Dalles Packing Company and William Mitchell.

The survey made by Mr. Hammond runs along the south bank of the Columbia between the river and the O. R. & N. track, and at times infringes on the railroad company's right of way.

The line is eight and a half miles long and for a considerable distance will be cut in almost solid rock. As the matter now stands, the government has first say on the right of way for a ship canal.

Mr. Mohler, president of the O. R. & N., was asked for information on the subject, but had nothing to say. It is thought by those in close touch with the situation that Mr. Mohler is not the man to give out such information and that it must come from Mr. Harriman himself, if the O. R. & N. the Short Line and the Union Pacific are one system under the ownership of Harriman's company.

If the State approaches the property owners along the line of the road in the proper spirit, there is no doubt about securing right of way without unreasonable cost.

When this is accomplished and the board of portage road commissioners make sure of the right of way, bids for the construction of the road will be at once advertised for.

By good work and management the portage road should be open for the 1904 wheat crop.

United States in Manchuria.

Washington, July 27—While there has been a lull in the Manchurian negotiations during the past week, it is stated that up to this point satisfactory progress has been made and there is every reason to believe that before the first of September next the treaty will be ready for signature, which will define the trade opportunities of the United States and Manchuria. An authorized statement of the situation is as follows:

"The question of the opening of new ports to trade in Manchuria has been, in substance, satisfactorily arranged with the Chinese government and nothing remains to be settled but the question of the date when said localities shall be opened. This naturally will be subject to the exchange of ratifications of the treaty in which the opening is agreed upon."
