New Commissioner Appointed-- Warehouse Bonds Approved-- Bills Audited.

The regular session of the county court convened at the court house, Wednesday of last week, and the attention of the court was occupied until Friday in disposing of a large amount of Morrow county's business. Owing to the resignation of Commissioner E. C. Ashbaugh, Judge A. G. Bartholomew and Commissioner F. M. Griffin constituted the board at this term.
