## Death of John C. Luce.

John C. Luce, one of the early pioneers of Grant county, died at his home in the John Day valley, Monday evening, September 13, after a short illness from peritonitis.

John C. Luce was well known, having been quite prominent in social and political affairs. He was a candidate for congress from this district in 1892 and was also in the field for gubernatorial honors against Governor Geer in 1898, and made a very commendable race in both campaigns. He was born in Iowa, September 20, 1842, and in 1852 came with his parents across the plains with ox teams to the Willamette valley, later removing to California. He came to Grant county during the summer of 1862 and was among the first party of miners that discovered gold on Canyon creek, and for years was engaged in mining and packing between the Canyon creek mines and The Dalles. He afterwards settled on the land on the John Day river where he continued to reside until his death.

The Fortune Mining Company, of Spokane, has bought the Red Lion group of mines in the Greenhorn district, Grant county, paying therefor \$20,000.

## Fishing on the Upper River.

The Dalles, Or., Sept. 17.—The Fall salmon fishing season opened September 11, and during the first week the run of salmon was exceptional for this season. The fishing is done with seine, which is somewhat of a departure for this part of the river. Heretofore all fishing was done with wheels or nets.

The cannery above this city is canning from 25 to 28 tons per 24 hours and is working to its fullest capacity. That the salmon is of fine quality is shown by the fact that much of it is being shipped from Celilo to New York and other extreme Eastern points.

Men engaged in the salmon fishing industry are of the belief that the fine season is due to the propagation at the fish hatcheries during the past few years.
