OREGON EXHIBIT AT ST. LOUIS.

State Commission Directs Energies Toward Gathering Displays.

Upon Oregon's exhibit at the St. Louis Exposition will depend to no small measure the success of the Lewis and Clark Centennial. Recognizing this to be the fact, officials of the Fair are now directing their energies toward the production of a suitable display of the state's resources. Active work is already under way, and by Christmas time, or possibly before, several cars of exhibits will be in readiness for shipment.

W. H. Wehrung, of Hillsboro, who has charge of the work of getting the exhibit together, reached the city yesterday for the purpose of consulting with President Myers, of the State Commission, preparatory to taking the field in active collection of the exhibits. Mr. Wehrung says he will make trips through the different counties in the interests of the exhibit, having learned by experience that little can be accomplished through the medium of the mails. He will call upon the different county courts and the commercial organizations of the state for substantial aid.

In accordance with an act of the late Legislature, each of the county courts is authorized to make appropriations, not to exceed \$1000, for the purpose of advertising the county's resources, and it is the intention of Mr. Wehrung to seek these appropriations in the interest of the state exhibit. Such of the exhibitions as are in fit condition will be returned to Oregon for use at the Lewis and Clark Fair.

One of the features, if not the feature, of the exhibit will be the products of Oregon's wonderful forests. Already much has been done toward getting together suitable collections of woods, although Superintendent Wehrung states that there is yet much to be done to bring the exhibit up to the highest standard.

Another feature will be the fruits and garden products. In this connection President Myers said yesterday that during his recent trip, in company with Superintendent Wehrung, to St. Louis he learned that many of the states already have their orchard and garden products at the St. Louis cold-storage warehouses in readiness for the exhibit.

"We have no time to lose," said Mr. Myers yesterday. "We must get these fruits and vegetables to St. Louis as rapidly as possible. We are now anxious to receive exhibits, and wish the cooperation of producers all over the state. We expect the help of the people in getting this exhibit together, and are now in readiness to receive consignments. We pay all freight charges, and the only expense to the exhibitors is that of a little energy and enterprise in packing

their products.

"We have made the best arrangements at St. Louis for cold storage quarters for this exhibit at a small cost, and even were the fruits sent today they would be in excellent condition when the Exposition opens. When the exhibits are placed, they will be arranged upon shelves and tables of Oregon woods, which will make them of double interest."
