CAPTURED INNER FORTS

Resistance to Japs Being Con-
stantly Narrowed.

ALL BUILDINGS DAMAGED

In Port Arthur by the Continuous
Firing and Main Powder
Magazine Exploded.

Chefoo, Aug. 24. —A junk which
left Liao Ti Promontory the night
of August 21 has just arrived here.
She reports that the Japanese have
succeeded in occupying Antszshan
as well as another fort, probably
Etseshan, about a mile southwest
of Antszshan. They have driven
the Russians from the parade
ground, which lies about two miles
north of the harbor; they have
destroyed two forts at Chaohanko,
which is within the eastern forti-
fications, and they have advanced
to a point near Chaohanko. This
news confirms information received
here previously, and which the lo-
cal Japanese were not inclined to
believe.

The junk heard firing until mid-
night of August 22. Scarcely a
building in Port Arthur remains
undamaged. The town hall which
was used as a magazine, has been
destroyed.

Four large warships, unable to
fight, are at Port Arthur. Only
one ship, a vessel with two masts
and two funnels, has guns on
board.

The fire of the forts not cap-
tured by the Japanese, together
with the effect of land mines, is
given as the reason why the Jap-
anese have not as yet conquered
the Russian stronghold.

HAVOC IN CROOK.

Band of a Thousand Sheep Killed
by Unknown Parties.

Antelope, Or., August 23.—
Mob law reigns supreme on the
ranges of Central Oregon, and as
an added evidence to the Silver
Lake slaughters of last spring,
over 1000 thoroughbred sheep be-
longing to Morrow & Keenan, of
Willow creek, Crook county, were
killed last Friday evening at Little
Summit Prairie, 40 miles east of
Prineville. This fact was announ-
ced last evening by telephone mes-
sage from young Keenan, a son of
one of the owners of the massacred
sheep, who has been acting as
camp tender for the four bands
owned by his company and grazed
in the Little Summit region.

Young Keenan states that while
the herder was alone and occupied
with the care of his flock during
the late afternoon, he was accosted
by three unmasked horsemen, who
departed after a short conversa-
tion. Almost immediately follow-
ing their disappearance a band of
about twenty horsemen, with faces
blackened, emerged from the tim-
ber unobserved until they had ap-
proached within a short distance
of him, when a command to throw
up his hands was given and com-
plied with, after which he was
bound hand and foot and blind-
folded by means of a grain sack
being tied over his head.

Leaving him near a tree, and
behind it for a protection from the
bullets, a general fusillade of Win-
chesters was commenced by the
mob, which lasted nearly two

hours, or until sundown, by which
time the entire band had either
been killed or scattered in every
direction.

Morrow county has never made any
claims of being a great corn country,
but fairly good corn can be grown here
just the same. Frank Evans brought
some specimens of corn to Heppner
this week that have been attracting con-

siderable attention while on exhibition
at the store of Minor & Co. The corn
which was grown about five miles be-
low town is 12 feet in height, and the
stalks are hanging full of large, plump
ears of corn. Judge Ayers of Heppner,
this season, for experimental purposes
planted several rows of Kaffir corn in
his private garden just to see how it
would grow. This corn when it does
well produces an immense amount of
feed, and the samples in Judge Ayers'
garden is enough to show that it will do
well in this country.
