The apparatus consists of a type writer which by depressing a key sends two impulses. Each letter only requires two impulses, and the different letters are obtained by means of the time interval between these impulses. For every superimposed pulse impulses operate a switch mechanism which is influenced in this way by the *duration* of the impulses. The pulses, which are produced by the type writer, are used as well as an electric current from the apparatus itself, and the fragment is only necessary to operate a switch which is placed beneath the typewriter. This makes all the conditions to the receiving apparatus, which consists of a coherent and a very sensitive relay.
