REPORT OF GRAND JURY.
Two True Bills as Result of Investigation.
Following is the report of the grand jury:
In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County.
In the matter of the report of the Grand Jury for the November term 1904.
To Hon. W. R. Ellis, Circuit Judge.
We your Grand Jury duly drawn for the November term of the above entitled court 1904, having finished our labors respectfully report as follows:
We have been in session three days, and have diligently inquired into all matters brought before us or coming to our attention. We have found and returned two true bills, and after careful and thorough investigation and deliberation have failed to find true bills or to bring indictments in the other matters considered by us.
We have visited and inspected all the county offices and the Poor Farm, and also investigated the conduct of all county and district offices, and we find that all such offices are being carefully conducted with competent officials.
We would recommend however that the management of the Poor Farm be improved. Upon an inspection of the house where the county charges are kept, we find that the rooms are not as cleanly as they should be, and that immediate attention should be given to an improvement in that respect.
Having completed our labors we respectfully ask to be discharged.

A MORROW COUNTY RECORD.
What a Good Farmer Can Do on wheat Lands.
The following statement furnished by Edward Glock, one of Morrow county's prosperous farmers, will be of interest especially to people who are looking for homes. The statement which is absolutely correct in every detail shows that Mr. Glock purchased 320 acres of raw land which had never been cultivated, for \$1650. DEAR SIR:
The following is a report of 1/2 section sod land that I bought in the spring of 1903 for \$1650, and sowed 300 acres in wheat. The land is in the south 1/2 of section 36, township 2 north, range 24 east W. M., about 10 miles north-east of Ione, Ore.

Harrowing 150 00
Sowing 45 00
Seed wheat 90 00
Heading 300 00

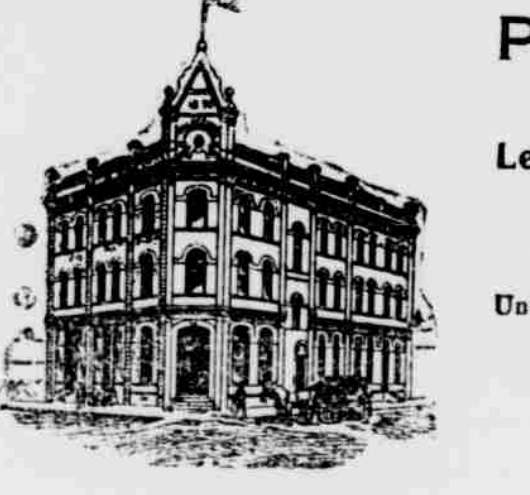

EVER LASTING SOIL.
Morrow County's Wheat Lands Will Never Wear Out.

That the soil of Morrow county is rich, especially in wheat producing qualities has been proven by practical test.
A chemical test of a quantity of Morrow county soil taken from the wheat belt near Ione, Morrow county, recently made by the late Professor Henry, of the Smithsonian institute of Washington, D. C., reveals the fact that this soil is of the same identical composition as that of Sicily, or a pure unquarried volcanic ash, incapable of destruction, incapable of being sapped of its strength, incapable of loss of soil, force or energy, incapable of being weakened by the growth of strong crops, or by any continuous process of single crop production.
Sicily has produced wheat for 2000 years and has never produced a heavier crop than that of 1903. Her soil is self-reoperating volcanic ash that supplies its own force, that yields nothing. It is simply pulverized and vitalized lava, and while it is not rich and deep and black as the washed alluvial of the river bottoms of Europe, it is indestructible, and has an endless strength and vitality.
