Three Months for Balliet.

Des Moines Nov. 26—Letson Balliet, the well known mining promoter, was sentenced to three months in the federal penitentiary by Judge McPherson, of the federal court, upon entering a plea of guilty of the charge of fraudulent use of the mails.

The conviction follows the expose of the White Swan gold mine scheme at Baker City, Or., with offices at San Francisco. Testimony was to the effect that Balliet realized something like a quarter of a million on the mine with an investment of \$30,000, and that the shaft is almost worthless.

Balliet was convicted after an expensive trial, but secured a new trial and upon a second hearing pleaded guilty.

The sentence includes a fine of \$300.
