Curse of Mist Shoes.

The national curse of the United States is no longer the drink problem.

It's a problem of walking—and shoes. Teachers attending the National Association convention at the Auditorium annex made the discovery that 90 per cent of the women and many of the men do not know how to navigate the streets properly. "Sliding," they say, "is not walking, and the 'kangaroo' high step is a jar to the nervous system."

First William Schuyler of St. Louis, startled the assemblage by announcing that by close observations he had discovered that a vast per cent of the women school teachers of the country did not know how to walk correctly.

"They simply slide along in the easiest manner possible, paying no attention to the rules of physical culture, of which they are supposed to have at least some knowledge," said Mr. Schuyler.

As this statement was not disputed, even by the women teachers present, it was allowed to stand.

Then President William H. Maxwell, who is superintendent of the public school system of New York, contributed the last link in the chain of evidence by denouncing the manner of walking of ordinary city girls as well as teachers.

"This is a national evil—a genuine evil," said Mr. Maxwell. "And it is being spread rapidly by the fact that people wear mist shoes."—Chicago American.

PART EACH YEAR

Continuing Contract For The Dalles Celilo Canal.

Washington, Jan. 8.—Representative Williamson, of Oregon, and Representative Jones, of Washington, who are working together in the interest of The Dalles-Celilo canal, have decided that the interests of that project will best be served by having it made a continuing contract. From now on they will exert their influence to bring about this result. If The Dalles canal is made a continuing contract it will be taken out of the hands of the rivers and harbors committee and, instead of being appropriated for in the rivers and harbors bills, will receive appropriations each year in the sundry civil bill.

It is agreed that it is more desirable to have this project made a continuing contract than it is to secure the maximum appropriation recommended by the engineers, namely, \$500,000. If it will be any inducement, both Williamson and Jones will consent to a material reduction in the appropriation, provided Congress will make it a continuing contract.

Should the desired change be authorized, the appropriation this year need be only sufficient to carry on the work

during the next fiscal year; if the change is not made, whatever appropriation is made in the rivers and harbors bill (if one should pass) would have to last two, and perhaps three years, until another river and harbor bill is put through. It is to secure annual appropriations, rather than spasmodic ones, that Williamson and Jones desire to have this project made a continuing contract.

There is only one continuing contract in Oregon at the present time—the project for the improvement of the mouth of the Columbia River. The mouth of the river will be cared for this year, regardless of what becomes of the river and harbor bill. It may not be possible to secure sufficient money in the sundry civil to complete the jetty at the mouth of the river, but enough will be provided to continue the work throughout the coming fiscal year.
