CREATE LIFE.**Chicago Professor Alleges That This Can Be Done.**

Chicago, Jan. 13.—Following the theory of Prof. Jacques Loeb and other noted physiologists that life can be regenerated, A. P. Mathews, associate professor of physiology of the University of Chicago, has declared to a class in that institution that before many months had passed scientists would be regenerating life in all the laboratories, for he says that this has been done in the lower forms.

The instructor of the class in physiology further asserted that in his opinion the origin of man was due to chemical reaction, but that the spirit of man was divine, in referring to the physical part of man, he meant, he said that he originated from a low form of life created by the action of chemicals.

Then he cited many instances wherein chemists have proved that life could be created in low forms. He said for instance, that it had been demonstrated that a violin string placed in water would show signs of action.

In similar experiments, Mathews declared, scientists would show that life would be generated, but he did not expect them to make human beings. The instructor also told how Prof. Loeb once caused the heart of a turtle to beat by placing it in a solution of salt, and that after it had been cut into slits the parts contracted and moved.

It is along these lines that Mathews is experimenting, and he is following closely the theories advanced by such men as Dr. Loeb. He is enthusiastic over the discoveries he has made so far, but says he is not ready to announce them now for the reason he might be misunderstood.

Morrow County, Oregon.

Morrow County is a new country, and like all other new countries, is awaiting development.

Located in the Columbia river valley, and skirted on the South with a spur of the Blue mountains, within the boundaries of Morrow county is a territory 75 miles in length by 35 miles in width, and containing 1,313,280 acres of land. Formerly stockraising was the principal industry, but latterly the fertility of the land is bringing agriculture to the front. Immense wheat crops are grown with little cultivation, the soil being mixed with a volcanic ash which is very rich in wheat-producing qualities. The 1904 crop will aggregate 1,400,000 bushels, much of it from virgin soil.

Morrow county has thousands of head of sheep, horses and cattle. The wool production for 1904 was 2,500,000 pounds. Alfalfa and fruit growing are profitable industries, rapidly growing in importance. The county has also a great coal field, soon to be developed.
