Better Cattle Market.

Scarcity of fat cattle is causing the packers to offer an advance over prices paid for beefs shipped out of the Pendleton country a few weeks ago, and it is predicted that before spring opens up the market will go soaring.

There are more than 5000 head of beef cattle fattening in the Butter creek neighborhood for shipment to Portland and Sound markets, and the first carloads will begin to move within the next 10 days. Six weeks is about the time required in getting a consignment of range stock ready for market, and as soon as the feeding pens are cleared another batch is brought in.

A recent shipment of cattle to Seattle is said to have brought 3 3-4 cents per pound on the hoof, and buyers are offering to contract for 4 cents for February shipments.

The damp weather of the present month is bringing out the grass on the ranges, and the cattle men hail this with delight, for it lessens the cost of fattening, inasmuch as the stock is in better condition when it reaches the feeding pens.—Pendleton E. O.

Carrie's Side Partner.

Hillsboro, Or., Jan. 11.—Mrs. Belle Bales, of Beaverton, yesterday entered the saloon of Rossi & Henriksen and smashed out a window and broke liquor bottles, damaging property to the extent of \$75. A warrant of arrest was issued this afternoon.

Mrs. Bales contended that her son, whom she alleges is a minor, was given liquor at the place, and she says she is willing to go to jail, as it would be in a good cause. Morrow County, Oregon.

Morrow County is a new country, and like all other new countries, is awaiting development.

Located in the Columbia river valley, and skirted on the South with a spur of the Blue mountains, within the boundaries of Morrow county is a territory 75 miles in length by 35 miles in width, and containing 1,313,280 acres of land. Formerly stockraising was the principal industry, but lately the fertility of the land is bringing agriculture to the front. Immense wheat crops are grown with little cultivation, the soil being mixed with a volcanic ash which is very rich in wheat-producing qualities. The 1904 crop will aggregate 1,400,000 bushels, much of it from virgin soil.

Morrow county has thousands of head of sheep, horses and cattle. The wool production for 1904 was 2,500,000 pounds. Alfalfa and fruit growing are profitable industries, rapidly growing in importance. The county has also a great coal field, soon to be developed.
