New Institution Ready to Receive Patients.

The Heppner Sanitarium, Heppner's new hospital is now ready to receive patients. The institution will be plenty big enough to meet all of the present requirements.

The R. C. Wills building on Main street, just below the Fair building, has been fitted up for a strictly modern hospital. To do this requires the expenditure of considerable money, but Doctors Higgs, Winnard and Kistner have decided to thoroughly equip the new institution with modern appliances.

The rooms have all been neatly fitted up and furnished and are very conveniently arranged for the best advantage of taking care of the sick.

The surgery or operating room is on the second floor and has been especially prepared in the most modern way.

The Sanitarium will be under the direction of a very able corps of physicians, consisting of Dr. Higgs, Dr. Winnard and Dr. Kistner, of Heppner, and Dr. Reid and Dr. Bruce, of Ione. No patient, however, will be barred from having the attendance of any other physician desired.

Two trained nurses who have had five years' experience at St. Vincent's hospital, in Portland, will be in attendance.

Early Lambing.

Gus La Fontaine will at once begin lambing 7000 head of ewes on his range north of Echo, says the East Oregonian. This is almost two months in advance of the regular lambing season, but Mr. La Fontaine's sheep are in first-class condition and he is prepared with plenty of sheds, and hopes to be able to make a complete success of his winter lambing project.

February lambs are worth fully \$1 per head more, in the Chicago markets in September, than the April lambs, and this advance in price is the object of the experiment.

Mr. La Fontaine will have ample help to take care of the ewes in the best possible manner, and will give every attention to the flocks and if the weather continues warm as it has been for the past few days, the lambing season will be fully as favorable as it usually is in April.

This experiment will be watched with interest by other Eastern Oregon sheepmen, who recognize the profits to be made in an early lamb crop. Jay H. Dobbin, of Walla Walla county, made a success of winter lambing last year, with a portion of his ewes, and had a colder climate and higher elevation to contend with than is found in Umatilla county.
