AN EARLY BATTLEFIELD.

Monument Lately Breeted on Field of Conflict of Century and a Half Ago.

At a grand public meeting of many thousand excursionists, including representatives of the patriotic societies of New York and New England, the Society of Colonial Wars unveiled, September 8, a fine monument upon the field of the battle of Lake George, September 8, 1875. The governors of New York, Vermont, Massachusetts and Connecticut were present at the unveiling, and there were detachments from the regular army and the troops of the several states. Senator

The bronze figures of the monument were designed by Albert W. Einert, the sculptor, and represent the Indian chieftain, King Hendrick, demonstrating to Gen. Johnson the futility of dividing his forces. The figures, which stand on a granite pedestal, are nine feet high. The monument stands in the center of Battle park, overlool ing the lake. On the east face is the following inscription:

"1903-The Society of the Colonial Wars erected this monument to commemorate the victory of the Colonial forces under Gen. Johnson and the Mohawk allies under Chief Hendrick over the French regulars, commanded by Baron Dieskau, with
