

# COUNTY

Number of Claims Against the County Unusually Large at This Term.

The regular term of the county court was convened at the court house by Judge T. W. Ayers on Wednesday of last week with a full board present.

The attention of the court was occupied for three days. The number of claims against the county was unusua'ly large at this time. In all 277 bills were audited, aggregating \$7,529,58 for the county expense.
