COUNTY ROAD BOOK.

Compilation of Complete Record By the Surveyor.

Morrow county is to have a new road book. The task of making a complete and comprehensive record of every county road in the county is a big job.

Lewis Kinney, under the direction of County Surveyor J. J. McGee, is now engaged in the work in the surveyor's office. Mr. McGee commenced the work about the first of last December.

When finished the books will be among the most complete records in the state. The surveyor visited several other counties to get all the pointers possible to help in the compilation of the work.

The record will be so arranged as to give a complete description of every road that has been established, whether vacated or in use, giving all the notes of the surveyor along with the usual data

Portland Owns Forestry Building.

That Portland will own the Forestry building is settled, for yesterday the Council appropriated \$14,000 for the purchase of the site on which it stands, and the Mayor stated after the meeting that he had withdrawn his opposition to the project and would heartily support it.

"If the Council had not made the appropriation today, it would have made the purchase tomorrow, as requested originally by that body," said Mayor Lane. "At first I was opposed to the retention of the building by the city, but recently I went out and carefully inspected it, and its magnificence impressed me, and now I am very much in favor of it. I have had the Building Inspector out to look over it, it could be kept in its present condition for many years."

When the Council, two weeks ago, revoked the ordinance ordering its purchase, and later reconsidered the matter, The Telegram made the statement that the building would finally be retained. This proved true, and all danger of the city's losing the building has now passed.—Tel-gram.

GREAT YEAR IN WOOL.

Oregon Clip Increased Nearly One Million Pounds.

The annual report of the National Association of Wool Manufacturers, just received, shows that the American clip in 1905 amounted to 253,488,438 pounds, as compared with 249,783,032 pounds in 1904.

The average weight of fleece of the entire country was 6.56 pounds and the average per cent of shrinkage 61.3. The total output of pulled wool amounted to 42,000,000, and the total production of scoured wool 126,527,121 pounds. The clip of Oregon in 1904 was 14,500,000 pounds, and of Washington 4,480,000 pounds.

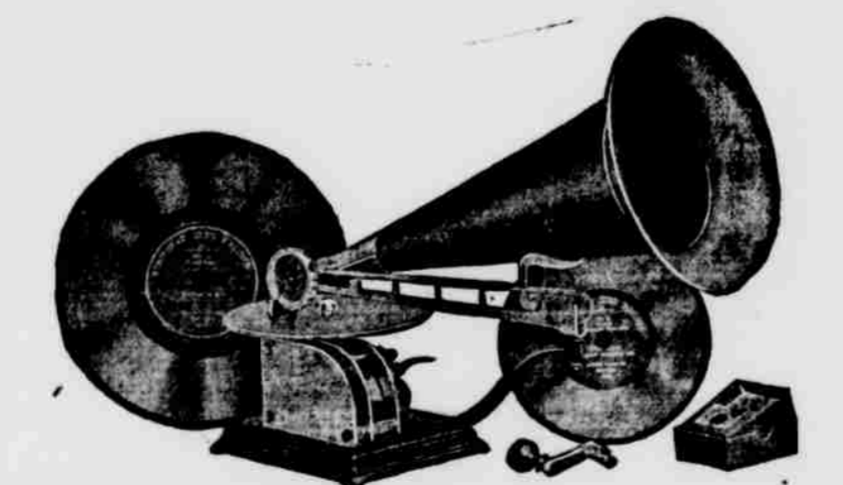
According to the report, the American flock on April 1, 1905, numbered 36,621,476 sheep.

The total number of sheep on hand April 1, 1904 and 1905, in the Pacific States was as follows:

The total domestic supply in the country-at-large is placed at 72,461,443 pounds, which, with 24,414 pounds of foreign wool carried, makes a grand total of 96,875,443 pounds of wool of all kinds in the United States unsold on January 1.
