**OREGON IS BARRED.**  
Sheep Cannot Enter Idaho Unless  
Dipped Within 10 Days Before  
Crossing the Boundary.  
Boise, March 22.—Finding that the  
proclamation issued on March 1, quar-  
antining all the sheep of the six ad-  
jacent states because of scab that existed  
there would not be enforced by the  
federal bureau of animal industry,  
Governor Gooding yesterday issued  
another proclamation of quarantine,  
placing the burden of enforcing it upon  
the state veterinary surgeon and the  
state inspectors.  
The new proclamation, the same as  
the former one, prohibits the impor-  
tation of sheep from any of the sur-  
rounding states unless they have been  
previously dipped, under either federal  
or state supervision, within a period of  
10 days before crossing the boundary  
line. The former proclamation pro-  
vided only for dipping by the federal  
authorities, and it was found these  
officials would not undertake to enforce  
the state quarantine and a new pro-  
clamation was therefore issued.  
The states quarantined are Montana,  
Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, Oregon and  
Washington, it being provided that  
sheep may not be driven into Idaho  
from any of them without dipping.  
Wyoming especially is said to be quite  
free from scab, but the sheep of some of  
the other states, including Utah and  
Nevada, where the sheepman threaten-  
ed under the former proclamation to in-  
vade the state with their flocks, are said  
to be quite badly affected by the  
disease.  
The question has lately been quite  
frequently asked, especially by the  
parties who tried to annul the livestock  
sanitary law, "What has become of the

## JONATHAN BOURNE, JR.



### Champion of Statement One

Jonathan Bourne, Jr., candidate be-  
fore the Republican primaries for the  
nomination of United States Senator in  
Congress, for the long term commencing  
March 4, 1907, was born in New  
Bedford, Mass., February 23, 1855; was  
a member of the class of 1877 at Har-  
vard University; came to Portland May  
16, 1878; was a Republican member of  
the Oregon Legislature in the session of  
1885 and the extra session of 1886; was  
one of Oregon's delegates to the Republi-  
can National Convention of 1888 and  
Oregon's member of the Republican  
National Committee from 1888 to 1892,  
and a delegate to the Republican Na-  
tional Convention of 1892; and was  
elected as a Mitchell Republican to the  
Oregon Legislature in 1896.  
Mr. Bourne has been more promi-  
nently identified with the development  
of the mineral resources of Oregon than  
any other man in the state, having ex-  
pended in the last 20 years over \$1,000,-  
000 of his own money in the acquisition  
and development of Oregon mines.  
While Mr. Bourne has had his resi-  
dence and main office at Portland since  
1878, he has had another office at New  
Bedford, Mass., and has carried on the

Including Columbia, Willa-  
mette Rivers, Coos, Yaquina  
and other Oregon Harbors.  
Celilo Canal, Government  
Canal at Oregon City. Fair  
Share of Irrigation Fund for  
Oregon. Loyal Support of  
Successful Candidates. Rigid  
Enforcement Statement One.  
Roosevelt for Second Elec-  
tive Term. I desire that  
the following statement be  
printed after my name on  
the nominating ballot:  
**I WILL SUPPORT PRES-  
IDENT ROOSEVELT'S DE-  
TERMINATION THAT JUST-  
ICE BE DONE ALL MEN.**"
