


Sheep Cannot Enter Idaho Unless Dipped Within 10 Days Before Crossing the Boundary.

Boise. March 22 -Finding that the proclamation issued on March 1, quarantining all the sheep of the six adj ining states because of scab that existed there would not be enforced by the federal bu eau of animal industry, another proclamation of quarantine, placing the burden of enforcing it upon the state veterinary surgeon and the

The new proclamation, the same as the former one, prohibits the importation of sheep from any of the suror state supervision, within a period of 10 days b-fore crossing the boundary line. The former pronunciamento provided only for dipping by the federal authorities, and it was found these officials would not undertake to enforce the state quarantine and a new pro-

clamat on was therefore issued. The states quarantine 1 are Montana, Wyoming, Utah, Nevada. Oregon and Washington, it being provided that cheep may not be driven into Idaho from any of them without dipping. Wyoming e pecially is said to be quite the other states, including Uash and Sevada, where the sheepmen threatened under the former proclamation to invade the state with their flocks, are said to be quite badly affected by the
