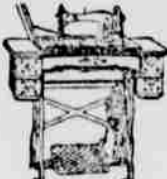

## BUILDING COMPLETED.

Home of Commercial Club Almost  
Ready for Use.

The Heppner Commercial Club  
building is now practically com-  
pleted and has been turned over to  
the Heppner Improvement Club  
by Contractor J. H. Cox.

The new structure is the best  
constructed wood building ever  
erected in Heppner and will be a  
handsome and comfortable home  
for the Commercial Club.

The new building will have a  
recess front with two windows 12  
feet square. The lower story  
which will be used for athletic  
exercises will be in one room  
44x80. The ceiling in this room  
is 18 feet high and there will be no  
partitions or posts in the way any-  
where in the room.

The ceiling is made self support-  
ing with iron trusses.

The lower room when all finish-  
ed will be very attractive. The  
walls and ceiling are finished with  
specially selected vertical fir and  
will be finished in the natural  
wood making a handsome room.

The floor of this room is also a  
special feature. Every board in  
the floor is from specially selected  
vertical wood making it almost as  
good as a hardwood floor.

On the back of the main build-  
ing is an annex 16 feet in width  
and extending the full width of the  
building. This addition or annex  
which is 16x44 will be divided up  
into several compartments in  
which there will be a dressing  
room and toilets, bath room, two  
show bath rooms besides there  
will be 24 lockers for the use of

the people engaged in athletic  
sports.

The entrance to the Commercial  
rooms in the upper story will be  
from the rear of the athletic room  
and there will be also a side  
entrance from Willow street with  
the stairway in the annex. The  
upper story which will be used  
entirely for the Commercial Club  
is arranged with eight rooms, all  
well lighted with not a dark spot  
in the building.

Upon entering the club rooms  
there is a large and roomy cloak  
room. On the left of the building  
is the kitchen and dining room and  
on the right will be the smoker  
and library. In the front there

are large rooms for billiards and  
the parlor. These rooms are  
arranged with arches and sliding  
doors.

The work on the building is a  
credit to Contractor Cox.

## JONATHAN BOURNE, JR.



Republican Candidate for United States Senator.

## Champion of Statement One

Jonathan Bourne, Jr., candidate be-  
fore the Republican primaries for the  
nomination of United States Senator in  
Congress, for the long term commencing  
March 4, 1907, was born in New  
Bedford, Mass., February 23, 1855; was  
a member of the class of 1877 at Har-  
vard University; came to Portland May  
16, 1878; was a Republican member of  
the Oregon Legislature in the session of  
1885 and the extra session of 1886; was  
one of Oregon's delegates to the Repub-  
lican National Convention of 1888 and  
Oregon's member of the Republican  
National Committee from 1888 to 1902,  
and a delegate to the Republican Na-  
tional Convention of 1892; and was  
elected as a Mitchell Republican to the  
Oregon Legislature in 1896.

Mr. Bourne has been more prom-  
inently identified with the development  
of the mineral resources of Oregon than  
any other man in the state, having ex-  
pended in the last 20 years over \$1,000,-  
000 of his own money in the acquisition  
and development of Oregon mines.

While Mr. Bourne has had his resi-  
dence and main office at Portland since

He says that the choice of United  
States Senator should be by direct vote  
of the people, and that the Legislature  
should be compelled to elect the man  
the people select. To accomplish this  
result, he is championing Statement No.  
1 of the primary elections law as the  
only method by which public opinion  
may be crystallized and made effective  
upon the Legislature.

In his petition for nomina-  
tion he says:

"If I am nominated and  
elected I will, during my  
term of office, Favor: Re-  
publican Politics. Amend-  
ing National Constitution  
for People's Election of United

penses. National Control of  
Corporations in Interstate  
Commerce. Rigid Exclusion  
of Asiatic Coolie Labor.  
Good Wages Make Good  
Citizens. Legal Limitation  
Labor Hours for Safety on  
Railroads. Parcel Post, in-  
cluding Rural Delivery.  
Pure Food Laws. Liberal  
Appropriations for Panama  
Canal, Coast Defenses, River  
and Harbor Improvements.  
Including Columbia, Willa-  
mette Rivers, Coos, Yaquina  
and other Oregon Harbors.  
Cello Canal. Government  
Canal at Oregon City. Fair  
Share of Irrigation Fund for  
Oregon. Loyal Support of  
Successful Candidates. Rigid  
Enforcement Statement One.  
Roosevelt for Second Elec-  
tive Term. I desire that  
the following statement be  
printed after my name on  
the nominating ballot:

I WILL SUPPORT PRES-  
IDENT ROOSEVELT'S DE-  
TERMINATION THAT JUST-  
TICE BE DONE ALL MEN."
