HEPPNER WOOL SALES

CLOSE TO 1,000,000 POUNDS SOLD
AT SATISFACTORY PRICES.

Owing to Late Shearing it will be
Necessary to Hold An-
other Sale.

The second of the series of wool
sales as advertised for Heppner
closed here last Thursday. Thir-
teen buyers representing all of the
principal operators in the Eastern
Oregon field were here to bid on
the wool.

Taking it all around the sales
were a success, however, there was
some difference of opinion among
the growers as to the success of the
sealed bid system. At Thursday's
sales over 900,000 pounds of wool
were sold ranging from 17 1/2 to 20-
7-8 cents per pound. Out of the
53 lots in the warehouses, 42 were
sold.

The season has been very un-
favorable for shearing and the
growers are late in bringing in
their wool this season. Owing to
the fact that quite a large amount
of wool still remains in the hands
of the growers it will be necessary
to hold another sale to clean up the
business. Owing to the uncertainty
of the weather the date has not
definitely fixed. It will probably
be in the first week in July. At
the next sale there will probably
be in the neighborhood of half a
million pounds to sell.

RUSSIAN WOLF HOUNDS.

Dr. Kistner Owns Some of the
Finest in the United States.

Dr. F. B. Kistner's Russian
Wolf Hound, Viadka, from the
Valley Farm Kennels, at Sims-
bury, Conn, carried off every
thing in his class at the recent
show of the Portland Kennel Club.

The dog appeared in four entries
and was an easy winner of first in
each entry, besides carrying off a
beautiful sweepstake silver cup
and two medals.

Viadka is a beautiful specimen
of his kind. His family comes
from the finest strain of Russian
Wolf hound blood in America, and
he is undoubtedly the finest
and most beautiful specimen of the
Wolf hound on the Pacific coast
today.

Russian Wolf hounds of pure
breeding are rare in the United
States and especially in the west.
In their native country, Russia,
they are held at high prices and
are noted for their intelligence,
speed and endurance in hunting
the great Russian wolves. They
are large, and while having the
speed and activity of the grey-
hound, have much more fighting
ability.

A peculiar characteristic of the
Russian Wolf hound is the fact
that the dog always seizes the
quarry by the side of the head.
Being very swift on foot the dog
will easily overtake a wolf and
when the opportunity is presented
the dog will seize the wolf by the
side of the head and will hold
with tenacity of the bull dog.

Dr. Kistner who owns a big
cattle ranch will use the dogs in
chasing coyotes which are increas-
ing with great rapidity in Morrow
county.
