Five linemen have been electrocuted during the past few weeks at Portland, and on August 15 Edward Stiles, a lineman, was nearly killed by coming in contact with a 2300-voltage wire. He was badly burned and owes his life to his belt being strong and holding him from falling into the wires outright.

The following sheep and wool notes are taken from the American Wool and Cotton Reporter: The season's wool clip of the Clear Range Livestock Company, which is composed of Helena, Montana, people and is operating what is known as the old Len Lewis ranch in Meagher county, was sold at Billings, August 14, at one of the best prices received in Montana this year. The clip aggregated 100,000 pounds and was purchased by Joseph Wing for Dewey, Gould & Co., for 22 1/4 cents per pound. Lewis Penwell, the vice-president of the company, who made the sale, says the price was a quarter of a cent more than was received for last year's clip and the sheep sheared about a pound and an eighth more than in 1905.

The Dickinson wool clip of North Dakota, this year is placed at 1,700,000 pounds. The fleeces were about a pound lighter in weight than last year on an average, but the price was 2 cents higher and the sheep men are feeling fairly well satisfied.
