BROKE JAIL IN
MORROW DAYLIGHT

Prisoner Escapes by Digging Hole
Through Stone Wall.

Isaac Quensenberry, who was
being held on the charge of larceny
in the Morrow county jail, gained
his liberty and is still at large, by
digging a hole through the stone
wall of the jail yesterday after-
noon.

Quensenberry's work was well
executed and daring in the
extreme.

This is the third jail break here,
each man getting away by going
through the wall, Sheriff Shutt,
knowing the frail condition of the
wall, has been careful, locking up
the prisoners in the steel cell
every day at the noon hour, and
from 5 o'clock in the evening un-
til 8 o'clock in the morning.

Quensenberry, yesterday after-
noon, picking a time when no one
was near the jail, secured a bar of
iron from the water closet and also
a big spike and succeeded in
digging a hole without being
detected.

Heretofore it has been the
custom of the sheriff to allow
prisoners the freedom of the main
room of the jail, from a humane
standpoint, the steel cells being
small and dungeon like.

Quensenberry stole a watch at
Irrigon about three weeks ago and
got as far away as Arlington, when
he was arrested and brought to
Heppner, where he was awaiting
trial. He is a young man, but a
typical railroad hobo.

Sheriff Shutt informs the
Gazette that he will ask the
county court to furnish better pro-
tection for the keeping of prisoners
in the county jail.

flimsy walls offer little resistance
when attacked with even an
ordinary pocket knife.

While the wall has the appear-
ance of being massive and strong,
it is an easy matter to pick out
the mortar and pull out the stones
that form the wall.

Real Estate Transactions of the

United States patents were filed
by Henry D. Sweet, S. E. Willis,
Wm. A. Gist.

A number of real and chattel
mortgages were placed on file.
Petition for the appointment of
administrator of the estate of
Albert Wright, Frank Gilliam was
appointed.

Andrew Donohoe, a native of
Ireland, has filed his first papers
declaring his intention to become
a citizen of the United States.

This is the first applicant in the
clerk's office under the new law
for citizenship papers. At the last
session of congress the old law
was changed, the new act going
into effect on the 26th of Septem-
ber. The main difference in the
new law from the old is that the
power and authority of granting
citizenship to foreigners is taken
away entirely from county or
other counts and placed in the
hands of the federal government.
When application is made for
citizenship papers, the clerk makes
out the intention in triplicate, one
to be kept on file in the county,
one to be kept by the applicant
while the third is sent to the De-
partment of Commerce and Labor,
at Washington, D. C., where such
matters are handled.

Articles of incorporation of
Morgan Lodge No 191, I. O. O. F.,
have been filed with the county
clerk. T. W. Atkinson, F. C.
Dillingham and H. O. Ely, trustees
of the lodge are the incorporators.
The duration of the corporation
shall be perpetual and the esti-
