Sheriff Shutt put the lid on Ione last week, and appointed Walter Cason as his deputy to enforce all laws. The saloons, the pastime and all stores, except what the law exempts, will remain closed on Sunday, and the laws as to gambling and loitering of minors will be strictly enforced.

The improvement asked for will be for continuous service from 7 o'clock in the morning until 12 o'clock at night. Heppner pays as much money and probably has the poorest telephone service of any town of its size in Oregon, and the people are getting tired of it.

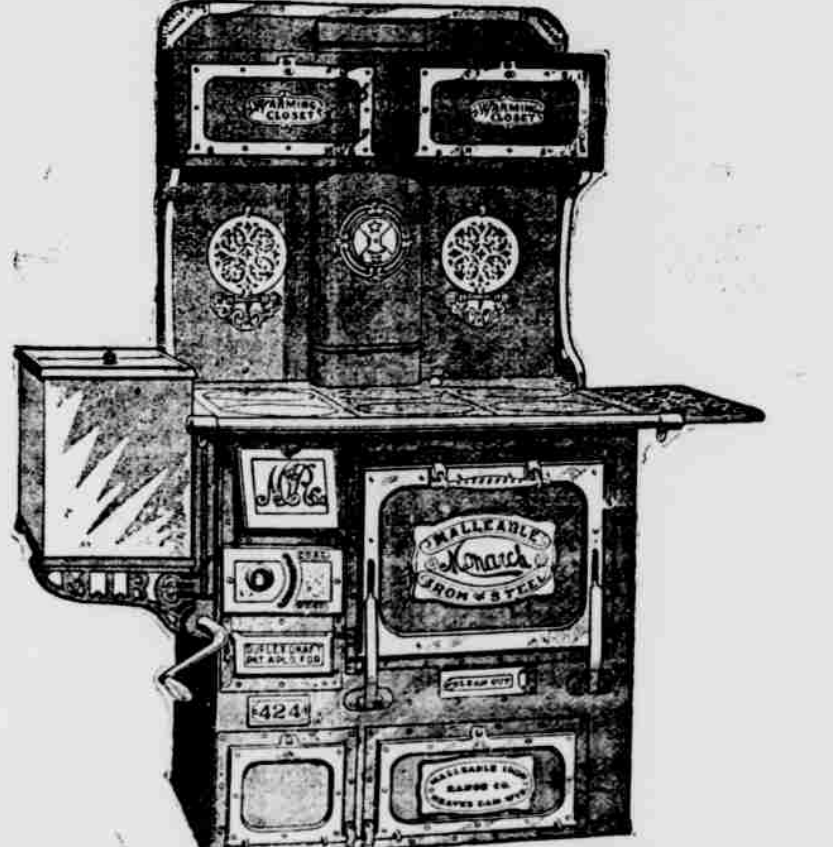
